- (1) LD GE A: (Basic Subjects) & B (Math) must be completed with C- or higher & by 60 units earned.
- (2) One American Institution course will also count for LD GE D.
- (3) One science course must include a lab.
- (4) Major course meets DCG-n requirement, complete one DCG-d course.
- (5) Depends on emphasis selected. Consult major advisor
- [6] ECON 323 meets major upper division economics elective and American Institutions (History) requirement (double counts).
- [7] ECON 306 meets major upper division economics elective, UD GE Area D, and DCG non-domestic requirements (triple counts).
- [8] Credit earned for remedial math will not count toward unit requirements for graduation, GE or major.
- [9] One unit additional depth of study "D" course must be taken with Econ elective if offered (3 + 1).
- [10] ECON 210L and ECON 310L are supplemental instruction courses designed to help students successfully pass ECON 210 and ECON 310.

Major Notes: The economics major consists of a core of 42 units and completion of one pathway, with two to choose from. Pathways range in unit requirement from a minimum of 12 (Traditional Economics) to 18 or more (Individually-Designed Interdisciplinary). If you choose a lower unit pathway, you'll have more room in your course plan for elective units. Consult with your major advisor before selecting a pathway.
