Notes

- (1) LD GE A: (Basic Subjects) & B (Math) must be completed with C- or higher & by 60 units earned.
- (2) One American Institution course will also count for LD GE D.
- (3) One science course must include a lab.
- (4) Complete 2 DCG courses, (one must be domestic) with courses that also meet GE.
- (5) Select major elective in consultation with major advisor
- (6) ECON 306 is the preferred option. Sophomores are discouraged from taking ECON 305 but may be used if that is the only option. ECON triple-counts as major, UD GE D and DCG non-domestic.
- (7) Five semesters of college-level language or proficiency is required. Language courses therefore depend on the level upon entering HSU. Your level of language ability may also affect the location of study abroad.
- (8) Take one methodology course: ANTH 318, CRGS 390, GEOG 311, HIST 210, PSCI 295. The semester of the methodology course will be determined by the course selected and which semesters the course is offered.
- (9) Take four courses (minimum of 12 units) concentration courses. Select concentration electives in consultation with major advisor
- [10] GEOG 363 is only offered every other spring
- [11] INTL 410 is offered every other spring and every fall. INTL 410 should not be taken with INTL 490
- [12] If not taken fall of junior year
- [13] If you have not already met UD GE B and/or UD GE C, take those in your senior year to meet all degree requirements. Consult advisor.

NOTE:

Students should officially declare their concentration as soon as possible. You may take some or all of your upper division concentration electives while abroad, but this requires planning. You may use study abroad to gain language proficiency. If you are already proficient in a second language, you may learn a third language. The study abroad location must "match" the concentration. One semester of language taken abroad counts as two taken on campus.
