



HSU over-60 program information

If you are age 60 or better and a California resident, we invite you to participate in the Humboldt State University Over-60 Program. Residency is defined as living one year in California. Participants are non-degree seeking (non-matriculating) students.

Costs: The fee is \$51/semester, and participants may take up to six units per term. (If you are a new student you must pay an additional \$5 fee for a Campus Identification Card.) Fees are due immediately when registering.

Registration: As enrollment is on a "space available" basis, Over-60 participants are among the last to register in any given term, therefore, no one can sign up for a class until the first day of the semester. You may peruse the online class schedule at www.humboldt.edu (go to Quick Links, Course Info, Class Schedule). Registration fees are due in the Extended Education Office (SBS, 2nd floor) when you register.

The designated Over-60 registration form can be printed at any time directly from the Web at www.humboldt.edu (click to the Over-60 Program from the A-Z index). Alternatively, the form can be picked up at the Extended Education Office, Student & Business Services Building (SBS 211).

To Register:

1. Obtain and complete the registration form. Attend the first class session, speak with the instructor, and if space is available, the instructor and department chair will sign. Once the application is completely filled out, bring it to the Office of Extended Education.
2. Monitor university deadlines regarding fees and academic regulations. (Dropping/adding a class, grade mode changes, schedule changes, late fees, etc.)

Credit/No Credit/Audit: Classes are available on a "credit/no credit" or "audit" basis or for a letter grade. Credit/no credit registration is applied at the time that you register. Auditing requires a special form approved by the instructor for each class to be audited. This form is available in the Office of the Registrar, SBS 133.

Dropping/Adding a Class: If you wish to add a class, or decide to stop going to class during a semester, you must do so prior to the deadline published in the online *Registration Guide* at www.humboldt.edu (go to Quick Links, Course Info, Class Schedule). If you need assistance adding or dropping a class, or if you wish to withdraw from all of your classes, please contact the Office of Extended Education.

ID Card & Library: As a participant in the Over-60 Program, you are entitled to full library privileges with the use of your student ID card. The \$5 charge for new students covers the cost of a new ID card.

Transportation Services: Once enrolled, you are eligible to purchase the HSU "Jack Pass," which provides local and county public transportation services. Students with a mobility disability may contact the Student Disability Resource Center (SDRC) for information about their services. All students requesting assistance must verify their disability with the SDRC. That number is: 707-826-4678.

Parking Permits: Before you buy one, estimate how many times your classes will meet. Compare that to a semester parking permit price (\$157.50). You might save money by purchasing a one-day permit (\$3.50 for a day pass or \$.75 an hour), or by purchasing the "Jack Pass."

Student Recreation Center: Once enrolled, you are eligible to purchase access to the Student Recreation Center.

Emergency Services: Health benefits are not available to students in the Over-60 Program. Emergency services are available at the Student Health Center (707-826-3146).
